of Huntington, NY passed away peacefully at 12 noon Saturday, March 17, 2012 at the Cold Spring Hills Center for Nursing and Rehabilitation, Woodbury, NY. She was 92 years old.

Mrs. Harding was a member of the Old First Presbyterian Church of Huntington where she was a Deacon and was active in the Women's Circles.

She received a BA from Ohio State University double majoring in psychology and education. After Ohio State, she taught 2nd grade in elementary school. She then joined a new airline, Trans World Airlines (TWA) as a ground instructor in Dayton, OH. Later she was offered the chance to open and run TWA's Paris office, but instead decided to marry a young Lieutenant Reginald Harding whom she met while in Dayton during the closing days of WWII. Mrs. Harding was a Homemaker for most of her married life and volunteered as a National Spelling Bee judge in the 1960's and 1970's for Scripps Howard Newspapers.

Born in Kenton, OH, on January 10, 1920, she was a daughter of the late Lee Kneisley and Florence Kneisley.

Mrs. Harding is survived by her sister, Mrs. Winifred Huffman of Naples, FL; daughter, Anne M. Harding of Huntington; and son, Craig K. Harding,

daughter-in-law Georgia, and grandchildren, Andrew and Maggie of Greenwich, CT. She is predeceased by her late husband Mr. Reginald Harding and her late brother in law Mr. Stanley E. Huffman.
