“ Dr. Kerner wrote his master's thesis at Fordham under one of the most famous European historians of the twentieth century, Oskar Halecki, who had been forced to flee Poland. He wrote his doctoral dissertation at NYU about Silas Wood of Huntington under an economic historian, George G. Dawson. When I met Dr. Kerner in the mid-1980s at St. John's, I was a graduate student working in the history department, and he was a newly hired adjunct, and I could see that students just gravitated to him. I was also told by a senior faculty member that Dr. Kerner retired from his teaching position on Long Island in order to save the job of a colleague - the school needed to cut a line, and someone had to go, and he sacrificed himself so that someone else could keep their job, build their career, and feed their family. Who does things like that anymore? Truly a role model.
