Charles Martin, WWII Veteran, another of our “Greatest Generation” passed away peacefully with family by his side on October 30, 2021.

Born December 24, 1924, in Brooklyn, NY to Arthur and Magdalena and lived in Forest Hills, Queens, NY. He served in the Army as a Technical Sergeant in the 544th EBSR Amphibious Division from 1943 to 1946, in New Guinea, the Philippines and Japan. He was married to wife Josephine for 74 years and lived in Melville, NY for 46 years, where son Jeff and daughters Patricia and Kathleen were born.

Charles joined the Melville Volunteer Fire Department in 1952, as the 39th member and served in Company 1 as a Lieutenant and Captain, then becoming Fire Chief, Commissioner and Lifetime Member. In his early years, he worked for Sylvania on the new thermal stovetop inductive technology and then moved to Grumman Aerospace, where he worked on the F-16 and Apollo Moon Project-Lunar Lander (LEM) Programs. He is one of the many technicians that had their names flown and landed on the moon on plaques that were affixed to the LEM-Lunar Lander.

Charles and Josephine moved to Bedford, NH in 2003, as their second home, where they have lived and have enjoyed the beauty of NH and family and friends.
