“ I had the privilege of working with Jose for 11 years, and I have to say a few things. This was a man who cared about those around him and was a joy to those who know him. He was our dependable guy, someone who we knew we could depend on with tough projects. But beyond that, he was a good person.

I remember driving with him, as he taught me how to drive a commercial truck the best he could for my training. He told me a story of when he was still working at a restaurant in Huntington, this was in the early 2000s. He was driving to work on Deer Park Avenue when he saw a vehicle leave the road and run into trees. He stopped and went to investigate, and saw the crash was very bad, they were unconscious and unable to escape. He went back to his vehicle and drove to the nearest gas station and called the police to tell them what happened. Some of the people of the vehicle survived because of his call and some did not, but if he hadn't been there they would have all perished.

Jose was a net positive to this Earth we inhabit, a man to inspire to be. In over a decade of working with the man, I never heard a negative thing about him. He spoke of his grand child and happiness with them often. He had just bought a house recently, and he was excited because he could entertain his grand kid. When he left the company (Lidl) he told me, "Hey Brian, if you are ever over worked call me and I will come over and help. No charge and for free, I know you will be over worked without any of us there, I would be happy to help if you need me." I told him no, because obviously that would get me in trouble, but the offer was genuine and I felt grateful - he cared about me, as he always did about others.

The world lost a great man this week, and all I can say is we need to honor him. Rest in peace Jose, you deserve it.
