“ As a field engineer, I first met Joe on board the USS Compass Island in Charleston, SC in 1974 and was immediately impressed by his technical capabilities. I worked with him in on several projects over the years in our Lake Success facility. He managed a group of very bright engineers and occasionally a few of them would descend on him with a problem and multiple approaches to solve it. They expected him to tell them how to proceed but after listening carefully, his guidance was frequently "Do the right thing." My impression was that Joe could have given them detailed instructions on how to proceed but he wanted them to solve it themselves. I first started sailing with Joe in the 1980's in his little 25 foot O'day. That boat was always at a mooring which meant the crew had to get to it in a small dinghy. I still recall an event one evening after our Thursday evening race. The crew was in the (overloaded) dinghy and I was in the stern seat as we rowed in. As we approached the beach, Joe figured he wouldn't get his shoes wet if he shifted some weight to the back of the dinghy which would raise the bow and allow it to go further on to the beach. He commanded Carl to move to the back of the dinghy against various protests. The result was the back of the dinghy submerged and I vividly recall my pockets suddenly filling with water! After much cursing and laughing we proceeded to the porch of the clubhouse to eat fried chicken and review the night's activities. As I write this I realize I sailed with Joe for 30 years and fondly recall the camaraderie. Joe was a good friend and will be missed.
