“ I met Joe nearly 24 years ago, when he was at OMB overseeing DSNY's budget. I was happy to be reunited with Joe thirteen years later at DEP when Joe had just been promoted to Deputy Commissioner of Customer Services. Joe turned Customer Services' performance around through his ability to keep focused on the goal and communicate with his team, his analytical talents and his insistence that any systems changes be thoroughly tested, or as Joe liked to say, "Let's try to break it."

In his first months, he was assigned the unenviable (and seemingly impossible) task of overseeing the design, procurement, testing and roll-out of the \$250 million Automated Meter Reading (AMR) program, the largest such program in the country. And, even though that program was in its infancy, Joe kept insisting that we needed to pair accurate billing with strong enforcement in the form of legislation that would authorize DEP to sell liens on the property of seriously delinquent homeowners. "We gotta have the Lien Sale" became Joe's mantra. Joe not only got the Lien Sale authorization he had been championing for over a year, but he also directed his team to complete the AMR program in a way that was different from almost all other major City technology projects: He finished it on time, within budget and, (small additional detail) it worked as intended from the very beginning and is now the envy of other water systems throughout the world. Joe's insistence on coupling the AMR technology with Lien Sale enforcement turned the \$100 million annual deficit that he inherited into a nearly \$100 million SURPLUS by the time he retired eight years later.

One of my fondest memories of Joe is that, on especially stressful days (and there were many), he would compensate for the stress by answering the phone in a very sing-song voice, "Customer SER-vice."

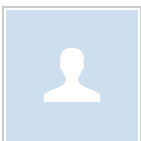
