Yi-Ai Chen

Mother and grandmother, a career physicist, Yi-Ai Chen died February 24, 2009, in peaceful sleep at the age of 87. She was born on September 17, 1921 in Rangoon, Burma. Yi-Ai lived with her loving mother, Wang, Rui-Tang, during her early childhood, and graduated from Pooi To Middle School, Hong-Kong. In 1942 she entered National Central University in the city of Chungking, China. After WWII, she studied physics at the University of Leicester, UK, and married late Dr. Chengzhong Yang in Liverpool. She and her husband later returned to China and devoted their lives in the physics research. Chen specialized in nuclear electronics and became one of the founding members of the Institute of Modern Physics, Lanzhou, China, where she was the director of the electronics division. She had a long successful research career, retiring in 1986. After the death of her late husband, Chen spent most of her time in the US with her children and grandchildren. She fought a long battle with cancer and cardiovascular diseases in recent years. Her weakened heart and lung finally ceased to function in the early morning of February 24, 2009. Yi-Ai Chen is survived by her daughter and son-in-law, Bingwei V. Yang and Rui Liu of Montgomery, NJ; daughter and son-in-law, Bingrong C. Yang and Yongshun Jin of Dix Hills, NY; Son and daughter-in-law Bingxin T. Yang and Yi Lin of Naperville, IL; son and daughter-in-law, Bingen B. Yang and Haiyan Wang; grandchildren, Ken Liu and Lisa Tang Liu of

Boston, MA; Richard Jin of Dix Hills, NY; James Yang of Naperville, IL; Sonia Yang and Tanya Yang of Arcadia, CA. A wake service will be held on Saturday afternoon, 28 February 2009 at the Jacobsen Funeral Home, New York Avenue, Huntington Station, New York.
